C) FAILING END OF SEMESTER I or II EXAMINATIONS

The student, who will fail End of Semester I or II Examination (s), shall manage other additive costs of supplementary examination. Currently the cost for supplementary examination is 10,000/- per supplemented Theory modules and Tsh 15,000/- per supplemented Practical modules. Also 50,000/= for special examination (when the student didn't sat for exam without any permission)

D) FIELD ATTACHMENT/CLINICAL ROTATIONS

- i. The Institute shall be responsible to find and allocate all students into various health facilities based on institute policy. The students shall depend on him or her on other running cost during this period.
- ii. When comes a student wants to conduct field practice outside facilities organized by institution , then;
 - a. He/she will be Responsible to find such facility on him/her-self and by his/her cost
 - b. He will inform The office of Academic the Name and Mobile Number of Facility In charge and Pharmacist in charge
 - c. The student will be responsible for paying for transportation, accommodation and food to his / her Supervisor where he/she is required to be inspected.
 - d. The hospital that will be accepted is of District, Regional, National or Referral level only and not otherwise.
 - e. If all of the above (a) (d) criteria met, without missing even one, then College principal will write Introduction letter to such person and he/she will present this letter to the hospital authority as required.
 - f. Failure to follow these directives will lead to loss of your practice point and No indoor Assessor will assess your practice, hence you will not be able to sit for End of Semester examinations.
- iii. At this college, only academic office is the overall in-charge of the field practice and rotational activities not otherwise. In this context there is No any other person, staff, student, board or committee that can interfere performance of Academic office in regarding to overall flow of field practice. If any person comes across, then it will be termed as breach of conduct and appropriate measures will be taken to that person as laws and regulations requires
- iv. Any person who is not willing to pay this shall find by himself/herself own permission from Director of the council of a respective city, Permission from R.M.O or D.M.O that directs him/her to conduct field at a respective hospital, and then submit these permission to Academic office.

 v. It is mandatory for a student to buy SOP Book known as "TANZANIA PHARMACEUTICAL HANDBOOK (TPH)" This book is Available At Muhimbili School of Pharmacy, or designed Bookshops for a price of Tsh 50,000. This should be available before commencement of any field work.

- iv. Continuing student must complete registration formalities within the first week of the academic year.Student shall commit themselves in writing to abide by the Institute's Rules and Regulations
- v. Student shall be issued identification Card: Loss of it should be reported to the office of Dean of Students with submission of Police Loss Report as an evidence of incidence where a new one can be obtained, after paying an appropriate fee of Tsh. 10,000/=

vi. A student will be given all required registration documents at the time of admission.

G) OTHER REQUIREMENTS

i. You are needed to bring the original form IV and/or VI Certificate from the National Examination Council of Tanzania or any other Certificate relevant for this course from a recognized Institute.

H) SPORTS ACTIVITIES

- i. Students are encouraged to participate fully in sports and games activities.

I) MEDICAL EXAMINATION

You should undergo a medical examination and bring a certified copy from a registered medical practitioner who works in a registered hospital, showing that your medical fitness is ready to purse a 3 years course. Use our form attached a with this Joining instruction

J) ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS (CA I, CA II, ES)

- i. A student must have been present for at least 90% of the classes to be allowed to sit for any continuous assessment.
- ii. A student who fails to meet a minimum of 90% attendance in a particular semester with compelling reasons as determined by the academic committee shall be allowed to repeat the semester otherwise he/she shall be discontinued from studies.
- iii. No student shall be allowed to sit for any next examination unless his/her average continuous assessment in each module is 50% or higher.
- iv. A student who fails to complete assignment(s) or research work in the scheduled time shall not be allowed to sit for continuous assessment.
- v. Where a student who fails to fulfil the eligibility requirements stipulated, sits for the end of semester examinations, his/her examination results shall be null and void.
- vi. No student shall be allowed to SIT for continues assessment if he/she has got No examination number
- vii. A student will be given examination Number only if he/she shall comply with the following financial provisions;-

- a. In Continuous assessment one (1), student must pay instalment I fee (100%) and at least 10% of Instalment II. A student who will not meet this financial provision shall not be eligible to get examination Number.
- b. In Continuous assessment two (2), student must pay instalment I fee (100%) and at least 10% of Instalment III. A student who will not meet this financial provision shall not be eligible to get examination Number.
- c. For End of Semester I Examination, student must pay instalment I fee (100%), instalment II fee (100%) and instalment III fee (100%). A student who will not meet this financial provision shall not be eligible to get examination Number
- d. For End of Semester II Examination, student must pay instalment I fee (100%), instalment II fee (100%) instalment III fee (100%) and instalment IV fee (100%). A student who will not meet this financial provision shall not be eligible to get examination Number

K) INSTITUTE FEE POLICY

- i. All above fees are subject to change by the institute governing boards. When this happens, all concerned parties shall be notified in writing.
- ii. GENERALLY, NO REFUND of FEE is permitted on account of withdrawal/absence from college or any other reasons once a student is admitted to any course of study.
- iii. A refund claim may, however, be admitted on merits after due consideration of the request by the Institute.If approved, the amount to be refunded shall be within the limits stated below:
 - a. Any time 10 days before the date of commencement of classes: Total fees will be refunded excluding the processing fees of 500,000 TZS (Five Hundred Thousand Only).
 - b. Anytime within 14 days from the date of commencement of classes: 50% of the first Semester fees.
 - c. After 14 days from the date of commencement of classes: No refund.
 - d. Any amount deposited into the Institution account will be treated as part of the fee and will be remitted to any of the unsettled fee within a semester, academic year or after the end of the semester.

L) MEDICAL TREATMENT POLICY
